## Dear clients.

We want to remind you that 2023 FORMS 1099 NEED TO BE FILED WITH THE IRS BY JANUARY 31, 2024.

For all corporations, partnerships, limited liability companies, tax-exempt organizations, sole proprietorships, trusts, and estates (but not for investment real estate rentals), the IRS has made the following questions a part of the tax returns:

- "Did you make any payments that would require you to file Form(s) 1099?"
- "If 'Yes', did you or will you file all required Forms 1099?"

If the questions are left blank on the tax return, your tax return will be considered incomplete. An incomplete tax return has no statute of limitations and is open to an IRS audit forever. As preparers of your tax return, we are not allowed to answer the questions on your behalf unless you have provided us with the answer. Please take the time to read the 1099 Reporting Requirements.
