2017 Foreign Reporting Checklist

Canadian tax law contains reporting requirements for Canadian residents who have foreign investments, own shares in foreign affiliates, have interests in foreign trusts, made loans or transferred property to a non-resident trust or have received a distribution or loan from a non-resident trust.

To help us determine whether you are required to file any of the forms relating to these reporting requirements, we ask that you answer the following questions and **return this checklist to us with your tax return information**.

It is very important that you carefully consider these questions when answering them. There are substantial penalties that will apply if the forms are not filed on time or filed incomplete. If you answer NO to the first four questions, this indicates to us that you will not have to complete any of the forms and will require no additional reporting. If you answer YES to any of these four questions, you may have to complete one or more of the forms and we may be contacting you for further information.

QUESTIONS:

1. Did you own or hold foreign property (i.e. assets located outside of Canada) at any time in 2017 with a total cost of more than CAN\$100,000?

Foreign property includes assets such as bank accounts, shares of Canadian companies held through a foreign broker, shares in non-resident companies (even if held in a Canadian brokerage account), foreign real estate (except for vacation property owned strictly for personal use) and loans to a person not resident in Canada. **Do not consider assets held in your RRSP when answering this question**.

2. Do you, together with related persons (including individuals, corporations or trusts), own 10% or more of the shares of a company that is not resident in Canada (i.e. a foreign affiliate)?

Note that this would include any shares you hold indirectly, such as through a Canadian corporation. In addition, certain non-resident trusts in which you, together with related persons, have a 10% or more interest are deemed to be nonresident corporations (and therefore will also be foreign affiliates).

3. Have you ever transferred property or made a loan to a trust that is not resident in Canada?
